National Restocker Lamb Indicator

The National Restocker Lamb Indicator is a seven-day rolling average of lambs purchased by restockers or feeders from NLRS reported salevards across Australia. It is expressed in cents per kilogram carcase (or dressed) weight (¢/kg cwt) and is rounded to two decimal points.

What is a seven-day rolling average?

At any point in time, a seven-day rolling average includes data from the past seven calendar days. In the case of the National Restocker Lamb, the dataset takes the average ¢/kg cwt of an animal matching the specifications of the Indicator per day for the past week, adds them up and divides the figure by seven. This figure is updated daily to create a rolling average value for this specification of animal.



National Restocker Lamb Indicator composition

The National Restocker Lamb Indicator includes lambs up to 12 months of age purchased by restockers and feeders with fat score 1 or 2 and carcase weight from 0-18kg (Table 1). The sales included in the National Restocker Lamb Indicator are outlined in Table 2.

How is the National Restocker Lamb Indicator calculated?

The National Restocker Lamb Indicator is the average price of lambs meeting the Indicator specifications for the past seven calendar days. It is calculated as follows, using the average live weight price (\$/head), skin value (\$/head) and estimated carcase weight (cwt):

1 The cwt price for each pen is calculated.

cwt price (c/kg) = (live weight price - skin value) \div cwt (kg)

2 The average price for each pen is weighted by the number of head in the pen. This is done by calculating the pen value.

Pen value = cwt price X head in pen

3 The National Restocker Lamb Indicator value (¢/kg cwt) is obtained by dividing the sum of all pen values by the total number of lambs meeting the Indicator specifications and rounding to two decimal points.

The purpose of the National Restocker Lamb Indicator



The National Restocker Lamb Indicator is designed to be applicable to industry participants across the supply chain. It describes what restockers or feeder buyers are paying for lambs out of the saleyard. Movements in the National Restocker Lamb Indicator follow the general trends of other MLA indicators, such as the National Light Lamb Indicator. That is to be expected, given many of the Australian and global factors that influence supply and demand have an impact across multiple lamb categories.

Performance

Since 2017, the average breakdown for the total share of eligible restocker lambs has consisted of 82% restocker and 18% feeder lambs. For the same period, the average weight of restocker lambs has been 13.9kg, made up of lambs (42%) and young lambs (58%). Typically, young lambs are those under five months of age, often unweaned or sucker lambs and with no permanent teeth. The throughput of restocker lambs through the saleyards is largely dependent on seasonal conditions and the time of year.
